**Vergers** As part of the process of agreeing this year's budget, Chapter has been in negotiation with David Lee over possible changes to the delivery of verging support. A more flexible working arrangement over 6 rather than 5 days a week has now been agreed. While a reduction in working hours is involved, the new arrangement provides support when it is most needed; particularly at the beginning and end of the day during the week and at weekends. It comes into effect on 1 May.
