Thank you for joining us in worship. You are in our prayers – and please pray for all those to whom we minister as a Cathedral. If you need any help please ask a sidesperson or churchwarden.

A particular welcome to the family of Lucas Gunga who is to be baptised during this morning's service. Lucas' parents Sachin and Hannah were married here in August 2020, with a virtual choir singing – so we are delighted to have wonderful music today to celebrate Lucas' baptism as a member of the Cathedral family as he is welcomed into God's family. The motet A Bright Flame has been written for Lucas by his father Sachin, our Cathedral Sub-Organist. The text is a prayer of St Columba, and the music is based on the notes that make up the letters in Lucas's name, combined with a plainsong psalm tone. It is also affectionately dedicated to Sachin's late father Yash (Dadaji to Lucas).

This morning: the President is the Canon Precentor and the Preacher is Kitty Price, *Cathedral Reader*. The Eucharistic setting this morning, sung by the Cathedral Choir (Girl Choristers), is the *Missa Brevis in D* by W. A. Mozart (1659-1695).


SIGNING WITH THE CROSS

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son. On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me. When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me. So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory. Great is the mystery of faith. Deacon Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again. All Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with Mary, Thomas of Canterbury and all the saints to feast at your table in heaven. Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

No one is obliged to receive the wine if they prefer not to - but intinction (dipping the wafer into the cup) will not be permitted, so as to ensure the best safety of all.
