



# Sunday 4th August 2019 Seventh Sunday after Trinity

I once said hello to Bill Nighy on Jermyn Street. I recognised his face, but realised too late that I didn't actually know him. To his credit he smiled back and said hello. This must happen to him all the time. With the radio there is a little more anonymity, but some voices are immediately recognisable, such as Moira Stewart, Linda Snell from The Archers, or our own Angela Tilby leading the daily service.

Those of you who tune into worship on Radio 3 and Radio 4 will probably be familiar with the voice of Stephen Shipley, producer for BBC religion. He too was often leading the daily service, as well as producing Choral Evensong and other programmes. Stephen has just retired, and we were fortunate to be at a farewell reception for him last week. He spoke about the exciting highlights of his career, including doing services in Russia, Spain and evensong from Ground Zero in New York on the first anniversary of the 9/11 attack. But he said that it was the daily and weekly services that kept him grounded and were constantly nourishing.

In the summer, choirs go on holiday, the lunch club takes a break, and a lot of things are out of routine. This might be refreshing for some; often it is in the quieter moments that we might recognise God speaking to us, as Jesus says in John's Gospel: "My sheep hear my voice and I know them, and they follow me." But for others it can be isolating, so perhaps each one of us could check up on someone who might be lonely? It is good to hear a voice that we can recognise.
